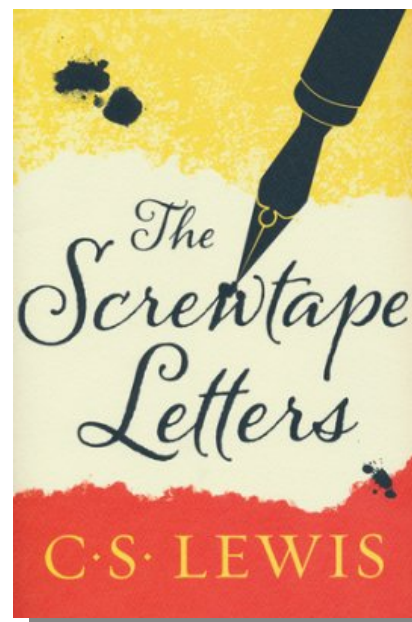

I realize choices abound for what to read and, of course, individual tastes and interests vary widely. Yet, I believe there is great value in sharing in the experience of entering into a book together and gleaning the wisdom and insight it offers. Plus, it's just a fun thing to do during the summer months, whether in town or on vacation.

The book I've chosen for this first Summer Reading Book Club is a classic, *The Screwtape Letters*, by C.S. Lewis. Some of you have probably already read it. My first encounter with it was in college. Some of you may have never read it, or anything by Lewis for that matter. If so, *The Screwtape Letters* is a great introduction to Lewis' writing.

For those unfamiliar with the book it is the story of Wormwood, a demon apprentice, who must secure the damnation of a young man who's just become a Christian. He seeks the advice of an experienced devil, his uncle Screwtape. Their correspondence offers invaluable – and often humorous – insights on temptation, pride, and the ultimate victory of faith over evil forces.



It is widely available in bookstores and on Amazon. Or, if you prefer to listen to your books, you can find audio versions on Audible or iTunes. Read (or listen) at your own pace. Later in the summer, after everyone has had time to read it, I'll schedule a time for those who've read it to come together for some conversation.

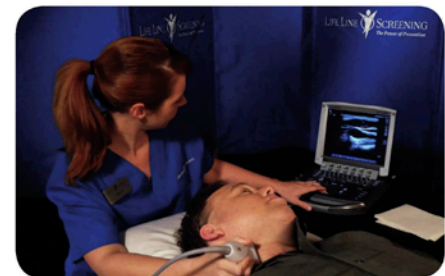

The Vestry met on Monday, May 15 at 7PM. A review of the Treasurer's April Report was conducted and approved. An update on the Jr. Warden vacancy was provided. Ms. Kaye Weerts has determined it was in her best interest to step down. The vacancy will be filled in June. All building-related matter should now be directed to the Building & Grounds Committee. The Preschool Committee provided an update on the Director search, and a new Director will be named in June. The Sr. Warden provided updates on a new copier for the office which will save the church money annually. Additionally, the Sr. Warden reported that a health screening event will be offered to the community by Life Line Screening and hosted at St. Luke's on Monday, August 28th. More information to come on this event. The Priest In Charge reported on various meetings and events, including baptisms conducted at St. Luke's, followed by a review of old business.
